# A WORD FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Caregivers

What a wonderful day of celebration we have had today. The Year 1-4 children have been showcasing their talents after a term of focusing on the arts. The breadth of talent in our young people is amazing. Thank you for giving us such talented, confident young people to work alongside. It has been wonderful today to have so many adults sharing in the successes. As you will all know, our children are tired; so focusing on our PB4L Values has been really important for us to help navigate this last part of our Term 2 journey.

We are continuing to work with Richies Bus Company on a plan to move forward; it has certainly not always been a smooth operation. One of our big concerns is the loading on the afternoon run. They have agreed to re-look at things from their end. They have asked us however to reinforce to our children that they too have a responsibility towards ensuring a safe and pleasant trip home. If your child is on the bus, could you please reinforce our bus expectations with them. I have attached these for you on the next page.

We are currently receiving modems from the Ministry of Education for some of our families whom they deem, through their data, not to have connectivity. My PA, Sarah Jane will contact you directly if we receive one on your behalf.

Once again thank you all for keeping our school as well as can be expected at this time of the year. We have continued to have a lot of both staff and student absences.

We will be hosting Student Led Conferences on Thursday 6th August rather than the more formal Parent Interviews. It will be an opportunity for our children to share with their family members their learning and showcase their classrooms. Whilst the teacher will be in the room, they won't be available for a more indepth, one-on-one conversation at this time. If you would like to organise a more in-depth meeting, you are welcome to make an appointment with your child's teacher to discuss any specific concerns. Last year 85% of our families attended our Student Led Conferences, so we hope we can increase the percentage for 2020. Should you be unavailable to attend in person on this date, we are happy to arrange a Zoom conference at a convenient time.

As always, my door is always open.




# **CALLING ALL CUPCAKE MAKERS**


