WHENUAPAI SPORT IN 2021

Enrolling your son or daughter in sport at Whenuapai School in 2021 will again be done through the Enrolmy online platform. The information will be emailed to all parents in late January/early February 2021. Parents are kindly asked to start thinking about what long term sports their son or daughter would like to participate in and parents are also advised that there will be a deadline and cut-off date for registrations of which must be met.

- 1. Teams that are entered will be based on availability of coaches and managers acting as support to our school teams and students' numbers registered.
- 2. Enrolmy website will give all relevant information specific to each sport.
- 3. Individual student payment through KINDO will be required <u>after</u> teams have been finalised.
- 4. Parents will be required to complete the Enrolmy online registration and agree to the terms and conditions if your son/daughter wishes to participate.

You will have the option of the following long-term sports in 2021 to choose from. Please Note: Further information about each sport including year levels and age grades specific to each sport will be given out when parents are asked to register in 2021.

HAVE YOUR SAY ON FUTURE TRANSPORT PLANS FOR NORTHWEST AUCKLAND!

Community feedback on a range of proposals for public transport, road improvements, and new walking and cycling paths is open from 30 November 2020 to 15 January 2021.

Te Tupu Ngātahi Supporting Growth, a collaboration between Auckland Transport and Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency, is leading the planning and public consultation process for future transport solutions for growth areas in the northwest. A Detailed Business Case is being prepared and they'd like to hear from the community to help them make decisions on preferred routes.

Leaving Whenuapai School?

If your new school is NOT on the list, use the **'close account'** button on that screen.

You can choose to donate your balance to school (where available) or have it paid out to your nominated bank account.

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YEAR 7/8 PRIZE-GIVING AND YEAR 8 GRADUATION SPEECH

Wednesday - 16 December 2020

It gives me great pleasure to welcome you all here today to our Year 7/8 prize giving and Year 8 graduation ceremony.

Today's ceremony is an opportunity for the Whenuapai School Learning Community to acknowledge our Year 7 and 8 students. It is also an opportunity to honour our Year 8 students who have completed their eight years of primary schooling and are beginning their next phase of learning.
