Tēnā Koutou.

Wow, the Curriculum Evening was fabulous, even if I do say so myself. Thank you to everyone who came and took part. The purpose of the evening was to inform our community about our core learning areas and based on your positive feedback it seems the information was well received. I do realise that during these COVID times it is difficult for caregivers to come out in the evenings, so over the rest of the term, we will share the Reading, Writing, Mathematics and Inquiry presentations via HERO so you can watch them at your leisure.

As the year is progressing, we are slowly reintroducing initiatives that have been impacted by COVID. Last week we relaunched our *School House Competition*. The House Competition is focussed on building team work, team pride, friendly competition and it also ties into our Positive Behaviour Management procedures.

On enrolment, students are allocated to a 'House' and will remain in that house for the duration of their time at Whenuapai School. Siblings are placed in the same house together and for our Military families, we do our very best to put their children in the house that is most closely associated with their parent's role on the Base.

Our four houses are; Seasprite, Hercules, Orion, and Boeing. Teachers are also assigned to these Houses as well - I'm in Seasprite (3). At school events, sport days etc. our tamariki are awarded House Points for participation, behaviour and sometimes placings. These points are tallied and added to the running total for each House. The House with the most points at the end of each term is acknowledged and celebrated plus they win the House Trophy, with the ultimate winner being announced at the end of the school year.









Our Schoolwide Positive Behaviour Management procedure also feeds into the House Competition. Throughout every school day the children are awarded Digital Tokens (Dojo Points) for positive behaviour and upholding the school value of Respect. These tokens serve two purposes:

- 1. To earn themselves personal acknowledgement (see our website for further information https://www.whenuapai.school.nz/our-school/pb4l/)
- 2. To earn points for their House a token also counts as a point for their House Group.

As a <u>Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L)</u> School we teach and promote positive learning behaviour. These two systems are intended to promote and acknowledge the types of positive behaviour we want our students to uphold, demonstrate and live by.

As a school and educators, we are always on a learning and improvement journey so we love hearing your feedback, whether it is; positive, questions or concerns. # THE WILLIAM PIKE CHALLENGE

Last term we shared information on the fabulous trips our Year 7 and 8 tamariki had undertaken as part of the William Pike Challenge (WPC). But what is the WPC and why do our Year 7 and 8 students take part I hear you say. Well let us tell you a little bit more .....

The WPC is a personal development programme centered on personal growth and experiential learning. We're heading into a future where many young people will have or are being taught outdated skills, susceptible to automation, offshore workforces and skills not suitable for new and emerging jobs. There has never been a more important time to focus on youth development and ensure our young people are equipped with a bank of 21st-century skills and characteristics. Not just for their future, but ours and the planets too.

The WPC programme creates a safe place for students to get used to stepping outside of their comfort zone by engaging them in new, challenging and rewarding experiences. It's these experiences that help build up a reserve of vital 21st-century skills that will help students overcome challenges that they'll no doubt encounter.

The WPC is a structured, specialist, year long programme designed for teachers and schools to foster personal development in Year 7, 8 & 9 students, to prepare our young people to overcome challenges and achieve their personal best through three key areas being:

- 5 Outdoor Activities
- 20 hours of Community Service
- 20 hours of Passion Projects

So far this year, our Year 7 and 8 students have completed three of the five outdoor activities. These activities include, learning to surf at Orewa Beach as part of a water safety day, a bush walk and boogie boarding day at Bethels Beach and an orienteering day at Huapai Domain in Kumeu.

Additionally, our students are engaged in a vast array of passion projects including activities such as rock climbing, karate, sport coaching, basketball, cooking and baking to name a few. As part of community service component, students have been involved with a beach clean-up and some students have also volunteered their time at sports events, road patrol duties and tree planting.

These experiences set up a foundation for exponential growth in a child, in terms of mindset, resilience, confidence and adaptability. All of this flows through to self-esteem, self-awareness, and self-confidence which every child is going to need to thrive in the world that's ahead for them. The WPC programme introduces tamariki to new ideas, new people and builds new relationships. It pushes them outside their comfort zone to enable them to gain confidence and build resilience to prepare them for some of the challenges they will be faced with in their future.

Whenuapai School, in conjunction with other external providers, has planned to deliver the outdoor activities allowing our students the greatest of opportunities and experiences to complete the William Pike Challenge Award by the end of the school year.

As a school and as part of the William Pike Programme we are always looking for opportunities for our students to volunteer their time as part of their community service component. # **K**AITIAKITANGA


Over the last couple of weeks in our Kaitiakitanga lessons, we have been making time for Tuakana/Teina (big & little buddies).
