Tēnā koutou.

The last week of term 3 has rolled around very quickly, hasn't it? And what a term it has been!

We have managed to squeeze a lot into the last 10 weeks. The School Production last week was an absolute highlight. It was the culmination of many hours of hard work from our tamariki, staff and parent helpers. Many hours were spent preparing, making props, rehearsing, selling tickets and setting up the hall, to get ready for show time. These hours of work certainly paid off, as the four shows were outstanding. The actors, singers, dancers, drummers, stage hands, support crew the list goes on, all did an incredible job. The hall was packed and the smiles on everyone's faces was wonderful to see. We are so very proud of everyone involved.

This week, 26 September - 2 October 2022, is Mental Health Awareness Week and we will be holding a mufti day on Friday for a gold coin donation, with all money raised going to the Mental Health Foundation. This year's theme is **Reconnect - with the people and places that lift you up, hei pikinga waiora.** We hope that you all get some time to do this throughout the week and also over the next two weeks of school holidays.

In this newsletter, I want to share with you information from the Ministry of Education (Ministry) about the changes being made to the decile system, and what this means for our school/kura and our learners/ākonga.

As you may know, we receive government funding and staffing to operate our school which is mostly based on the number of ākonga we have. There is also some government funding that is targeted. This includes 'Equity Funding'. Currently our Equity Funding is based on how many students we have and our school decile, but from 2023 school deciles will be phased out. The Ministry has a new measure called the Equity Index (EQI).

The EQI helps identify schools and kura that need additional funding and resources to support ākonga. The EQI gives each school a three-digit number which is tied to a funding rate. This number is not a measure of quality. It is not reflective of our schools' teaching, culture, ākonga ability or achievement.

The EQI is a complex tool with strict privacy protections. School Boards, Principals and staff will not be provided with any information about ākonga, families or whānau, that has been used to generate their EQI number. This number will be updated every year.

For 2023, our number is 405. The average [national] Equity Index number is 463.

Another funding change happening next year is that the Ministry is making changes to the Isolation Index. This tells the Ministry how isolated our school is compared to others. It was last changed 20 years ago and of course there have been lots of changes to roads and our region in that time.

WILLIAM PIKE PROGRAMME ACTIVITY 4

TE RAU PURIRI REGIONAL PARK — SOUTH HEAD

As part of the Whenuapai School William Pike Programme for Year 7 & 8 students, 71 students attended a bush tramp on Friday 16th September to Te Rau Puriri Regional Park out at South Head past Helensville.


The group boarded buses just before 9.00am and the bus ride took approximately 55 minutes to get to the carpark at the start of the tramp. The weather on the day showed glimpses of rain but generally the day was fine with a moderate cool breeze upon our arrival. The sights and views overlooking the Kaipara Harbour were amazing and students were eager to get started on their trek. The walk was 6km in total and the group started at the top peak and did a loop track that took them all the way down the main ridge to the harbour, where they had lunch. There was an opportunity for the students to go onto the foreshore of the harbour and explore as the tide was out before the group departed and started their climb back up the ridge returning to the carpark where they first started.

The objectives of the day were to develop our students William Pike Challenge 21st Century skills by participating and experiencing the outdoors in a challenging but yet achievable activity. These learning skills are below and it was a great opportunity while students completed the tramp to see the qualities of resilience and commitment, support, tenacity and perseverance when students collectively completed the tramp and did so overcoming the challenges of the walk.

It was great for some of the students to experience a new activity and it was a pleasure to see the support from other students especially when the group started the climb back up the ridge as the gradual climb tested a few students

Overall, it was a great day and the students are to each other and put themselves out to try a new act


