WILLIAM PIKE CHALLENGE

Last week, as part of the William Pike Programme, 69 Year 7 & 8 students, experienced a bike ride, adventure-based learning games and raft building day, at Christmas Beach, Herald Island. For this event, students biked from Whenuapai School to Christmas Beach and then return to school, later that day. This 40-45 minute bike ride (each way) challenged students and for some tested their personal comfort zone. Our students succeeded while showing commitment, perseverance, and resilience to start and then accomplish the end goal of riding the route. They are to be commended on this achievement.

For some students their inspiration, knowledge and skills came from the 'BikeReady Course' they completed with Harbour Sport, prior to the challenge. This course allowed each student to have the competency, skills and knowledge about safe practices when riding on the road. The course set the tone and developed more capable and proficient bike riders with greater confidence in their own capabilities.

The objectives of the day were to increase bike competency for students, through experiencing the enjoyment of learning how to be safe on the roads. It was also to give students the confidence to be active and have fun with recreation and leisure pursuits like bike riding. To educate and encourage participants that bike riding is for everyone regardless of size, skill and ability. Once at the location, of Christmas Beach, the student's objectives were to develop teamwork, cooperation and communication skills through problem-solving initiatives. This was done by students engaging in team building activities. These activities were facilitated by a company called Bigfoot Adventures, who are an independent company that provided equipment as well as personnel, and shared their knowledge and expertise to support our students learning.

While half of the students built rafts in teams, the others completed adventure-based learning initiatives and problem-based learning activities. During which, students worked on effective communication and cooperation skills. Inevitably, some individuals and teams functioned well together while for others the experience was one of development and progress. Overall, the process was that students were pushed out of their comfort zone and challenged to new ideas aligned with extended ways of thinking within practical problem-based tasks.

It was a great two days, and the students are to be commended on how they conducted themselves and represented the School. Feedback shows that they enjoyed the experience and were challenged by the group and team tasks on both days which lead to several personal and team accomplishments in students learning.

Whenuapai School would like to thank Harbour Sport for their support of our school through the student 'BikeReady Course' prior to the event and also for lending us a number of bikes for students to ride on the day. We would also like to thank our parent helpers for their support on the day. You were all amazing and we couldn't have done it without you all. This includes Limor Walhaus-Yahel, Elisha Yahel, Janice Chiu, Sarah Murray, Jelena Nasmith, Kerry Berry, Morgan Vermeulen, Heidi Murray, Paul Brinkman and Sylvan Hosking. Without you all the day wouldn't have been the success it was.
