Online Safety -Thank you to everyone who attended the evening presentation on online safety with John Parsons. I hope you found it useful. I certainly learnt a few things which resulted in some in-depth conversations with my teenagers about their online safety and security.

John will be sharing some videos and news articles which cover the majority of his content and we will release these over the coming weeks as soon as they are available.

Some of John's key messages were:

- Parents and extended family need to be active in their child's online world. This means being present in their social media platforms and commenting on their posts etc.
- No photos should be shared on social media that are taken in bedrooms, bathrooms or whilst wearing pyjamas.
- And most importantly social media accounts should be private and parents should be in the child's profile picture, if it is a photograph. This is to show that adults in the child's life are actively present in their online and real world.
- For their safety, children should only be playing / using age appropriate games and social media.

We are pleased to announce that our Linewize Online Safety Parent Hub is now live and includes access to the Qustodio Parent app. This hub has a wealth of information on supporting your tamariki in a digital world. 2023 Year 7 & 8 School-Based **Immunisation Programme**

Waitematā

Year 7 students will be offered Boostrix vaccine (Tdap) in school. This vaccine is a booster of tetanus, diphtheria, and whooping cough (pertussis). Most children received these immunisations as pre-schoolers. This is scheduled for Middle of March with a catchup date 1-2 weeks later for students absent on the day.

Year 8 students will be offered human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine in school. This is a New Zealand schedule vaccine that is recommended to be given at 12 years of age. Students need two doses with a 6-month gap between dose 1 and 2. This is scheduled for term 4 with a catchup date 1-2 weeks later for students absent on the day.

Information on the vaccine and a consent form will be sent home with your child. Please complete the form and return to the school. If you would like more information on this important immunisation programme, please go to School Immunisations or Alice McVeigh the schools Public Health Nurse on 0212274022
