EOTC Week at Whenuapai School

Tamariki in Years 5-8 who did not attend camp, instead completed a week of Education Outside the Classroom (EOTC) activities. This week was coordinated by Greg Berry and Sarah Bone. The students completed learning centered on group initiative activities including, quality learning, outdoor leadership, rock climbing, EOTC safety and risk management as well as Garden to Table lessons and food preparation.

As part of this programme of learning they also spent a day at the Vertical Adventures Rock Climbing Centre in Glen Eden where they enjoyed learning and developing their skills in the recreational activity of rock climbing. All students were extremely committed to improving their skills and many students performed multiple climbs up and down the various walls that they had. Students also took up opportunities to do advanced climbs while teachers and parents supported by belaying and assisting them.

During the EOTC week students also spent a day at Taupaki School for a range of technology classes. This was a real highlight for our Year 5 and 6 students who have never been before. Then on Thursday students worked alongside Sarah Bone to prepare a two course meal using local produce from the school and Air Base. The meal was fritters with salad and a dessert course of apple crumble which was delicious. The meal was attended by our Principal, Adam Cels, and students are to be commended on how they prepared, presented and delivered the meal while also working as a team to clean up at the completion of the sit down meal. Whenuapai School are looking for parents and children to join the walking school bus (WSB).



A walking school bus is an organised group of children walking to and/or from school under the supervision of adults. WSB can operate from one to five days a week, depending on volunteer commitment.

Children are collected from stops or a parking spot along a planned route and walk together to the school gate. Along the way they learn road safety, socialise and share stories with friends and neighbours and arrive energised at school. Families in the community get to know each other. What a great way to travel to school!

Walking school buses are run by parents/ caregivers/ grandparents from the school community with the support of the school and Auckland Transport.


