Tēnā koutou,

Our first week was awesome, it was wonderful to have the tamariki back with all their enthusiasm and excitement. Schools are a desolate place without children.

How were the school holidays for your family?

I didn't do anything exciting; I did manage to squeeze in some family time, but I spent a considerable amount of time at school or working from home trying to get my head around the Curriculum Refresh. Personally, I don't think Refresh is the right wording. It is effectively going to be a new curriculum - the third in my educational career.

The Ministry of Education states 'The refreshed curriculum will support every ākonga (learner) to experience success in their learning. It will give effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi, and it will be inclusive, clear about the learning that matters, and easy to use from year 0 to year 13'. The new name for the curriculum is Te Mātaiaho.

The curriculum refresh is scheduled to be completed over a 6-year period. As a kura we will keep you informed of the changes that will impact our way of being and our learning and teaching programmes. In the meantime, further information can be found at:

During our 'Teachers Only Day' we started to explore the new curriculum with a particular focus on the reasons for the changes and the new curriculum structures.

During terms 3 and 4, our School Board will be seeking your input (in a variety of ways) on a number of topics to help direct the future strategic direction of our kura. They love to hear your perspective, so I encourage you to take part in this consultation process.

Work continues, at pace, on our new Whenuapai School Senior Campus. The groundwork is drawing to a close and the first of our classrooms are expected to arrive in about a month. Hopefully everything continues to go to plan and we can move in early in term 3.

Our Year 5 -8 tamariki are away at camp meaning our junior students have free range of the entire school grounds. The kura feels empty but it has meant the younger children have been discovering new ways to play and utilise the playing space. The juniors are looking forward to trips later in the term. I think my favourite is going to be when Conscious Kids Junk Play visits Year 1 and 2. I can't wait to see what the tamariki will create with the upcycled materials.

Parent Interviews are being held on Tuesday 16th May and Thursday 18th May 2023. We have moved them to Term 2 to slightly change the focus. Rather than the interview solely focusing on the progress of your tamariki we would like the meetings to also include an opportunity for you to discuss with the kaiako how you are going to work with us to support your child for the remainder of the year to ensure they reach their full potential and learning milestones. By having the meetings in term 2, we all still have time to make a positive difference for your tamariki during the 2023 school year. Booking information will be posted on HERO soon.

So much going on, but it is all so exciting. Looking forward to a great term.

Cricket Success


