It's been another jam-packed fortnight here at Whenuapai School and I wanted to start by saying a special thank you to all our incredible whānau for your support on Wednesday afternoon for the Teacher Paid Union Meetings. Many of our families were able to pick up their tamariki early on Wednesday afternoon and this allowed us to change our normal learning programme to support a smaller number of students and allowed all teachers to attend this important union meeting. We understand that this was a big ask, especially with such short notice and we appreciate all your support and understanding.

As you may have seen posted on HERO on Tuesday, we started this week with some disappointing news. Unfortunately, the opening date of our new Senior Campus on Trig Road has been extended. The original completion date was the start of Term 3, but due to the contractor delays, the campus is now expected to be completed at the end of Term 3. This means our senior students will now start learning from the new campus at the start of Term 4.

We were saddened by the news, however we remain positive and focused on the end goal of what an amazing campus this will be for our tamariki, whānau and staff when it is completed. We are maintaining regular communication with the Ministry of Education (MoE) to ensure that their construction partners address the issues and expedite the project. We will continue to provide updates on the progress of the build, and we have formally requested the presence of the MoE at a community meeting where we can collectively discuss the delay and answer any of your questions.

In the meantime, we will continue to run our excellent learning programmes here at the home campus and we will keep any disruptions to a minimum.

Speaking of our excellent learning programmes we are proud of what we offer our Year 7 and 8 tamariki and we want to show you what we do and how we do it! To do this, we are holding a Year 7/8 Curriculum Evening on Wednesday, 14 June 2023 from 5.00 - 6.00pm. We would like to invite students and their whānau to this special evening to see and learn more about what we have to offer in our senior school. This is a wonderful opportunity to see our programmes in action and ask any questions that you may have. The evening is open to all year levels but highly recommended for families who have students currently in Year 6 and 7. We look forward to seeing you there!

A friendly reminder that this weekend is an extra long one. School is closed on Monday, 5th June, for King's Birthday weekend and again on Tuesday, 6th June, for our Teachers Only Day (TOD). The TOD is to allow our teachers to attend the Kahui Ako professional development conference. The first day back at school is Wednesday, 7th June.

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
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


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
