Term 3 already, the year is certainly flying by at a great rate of knots.

A huge welcome to our new families from our new school zone - Massey Redhills. It is wonderful to have you join our Whenuapai whanau and we look forward to your involvement and contribution to our kura. This will be another milestone in our long and successful history. Welcome to all families who joined our kura last week. Our roll has grown to 532 tamariki and we are projecting an end of year total of 550. If you are aware of any tamariki or families who will be starting school this year or in term 1 2024, who are not yet enrolled, please encourage them to get in touch with our wonderful Claire in the office. This will help us with our forward planning.

As the school grows I thought it would be timely to reminder you about our school values:

- Mana Respect for Self
- Ako Respect for Learning
- Kotahitanga Respect for Others
- Kaitiakitanga Respect for the Environment

These values are incredibly important to us at Whenuapai, as they promote and develop kotahitanga (unity) and whanaungatanga (close connection between people) across the school. These values are actively taught in lessons and used to promote and acknowledge positive classroom and playground behaviour.

Room 25 is finished and open. The tamariki started in their new classroom yesterday, and I know Miss Ward is excited to have her new space. It is a beautiful classroom and feels like it has always been there. Thank you to the Ministry of Education for installing this classroom in such a short period of time. This is a temporary classroom and will be removed at the end of term 3. The Room 25 tamariki will move into Room 14 when the Year 7 and 8 students move across to their new campus.



Looking ahead - it is going to be an exciting term with lots happening including but not limited to: inquiry performance, school cross country, interschool rippa rugby, netball and the tough guy and girl challenge. One of the big events that we have introduced for 2023 is AIMS games. The Zespri AIMS Games gives 11, 12 & 13 year olds an opportunity to compete as an individual or a team against their age in NZ & invited countries in 25 sporting codes. The event is run like the olympic games over a week and there are over 11,500 competitors. 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
WHENUAPAI SCHOOL WALKING SCHOOL BUS

At the end of Term 2, our tamariki put together an incredible Innovation Expo.


The school hall looked fantastic filled with our tamariki's learning, presentations and sale items. They were so excited to be able to show their whānau members.

The work on display was outstanding and we are very proud of our talented hard working tamariki.




KEA TEAM LEARNING


