Tēnā koutou,

The Education space in Aotearoa New Zealand is a dynamic and constantly evolving landscape, dedicated to fostering positive outcomes for the tamariki (children) of Aotearoa New Zealand. We are currently embarking on two significant and transformative endeavors that aim to enhance the educational experience for tamariki at Whenuapai School: Te Mātaiaho, and Te Whakangārahu Ngātahi.

Te Mātaiaho - The New Zealand Curriculum Refresh is an initiative that aims to create a better and more culturally responsive curriculum for our diverse learners. Te Mātaiaho is underpinned by 3 curriculum principles:

- 1. Give effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi
- Hold a broad view of ākonga (learners) success
- Hold high expectations for all ākonga (learners)

The refreshed curriculum will be progression-focused, rather than outcomes-focused with Mātauranga Māori sitting at the core of the learning areas, with key competencies, literacy, and numeracy explicitly woven into each learning area. This is all aimed at building a dynamic and evolving curriculum unique to Whenuapai School and Aotearoa New Zealand.

Te Whakangārahu Ngātahi - Planning Together for Ākonga Success is a programme that focuses on improving planning and reporting practices in our school. It underscores our commitment to equitable, inclusion and outstanding outcomes for all tamariki. This change highlights the vital role that whanau (families) and the wider community play in the educational journey of their tamariki.

To bring about these changes, we need your input and ideas. We have conducted a Whānau Survey to gather your perspectives. Your feedback will be crucial in shaping our school's strategic plan, aligning it with the aspirations and priorities of our community. After collecting feedback, the Board will create a draft plan for further consultation and feedback.
