(4.1) Te Tiriti of Waitangi Training

Opened with a Karakia - a blessing for our time together.

Brenda introduced herself and shared her experience as a teacher/professional.

Introduced MAC - Maori Achievement Collective - works alongside schools to become an inclusive school, creating a plan to support and improve Maori achievement.

Talked about Te Tiriti o Waitangi and the history of the treaty. Covered the when, who, where, why, and what was promised. Spoke about the four articles of Te Tiriti - Kawanatanga, Tino Rangatiratanga, Oritetanga, and Wairuatanga, and the differences in the versions of the Treaty.

Why the focus on Maori in Education - The Waitangi Tribunal's 1986 Te Reo Mori report found that Maori children were not adequately educated due to prolonged systemic failure.

Talked about the Education and Training Act 2020: Giving better effect to Te Tiriti O Waitangi. One of the objectives is for the board to ensure that the school gives effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi. Looked at the NELP and the objectives, and how they relate to the board.

What does this look like at our school?

- Understanding of the Treaty and its implications for schools
- Maori perspective in governance and engagement

When we make a decision, we need to consider if there will be anyone that is disadvantaged by this decision.
