A huge highlight of the term was in Week 8, when a group of 19 Whenuapai tamariki had the incredible opportunity to attend the 2023 Zespri AIMS Games in Tauranga. The AIMS Games gives students in Years 7 & 8 (11, 12 &13 year olds) an opportunity to compete as an individual or a team against their age in New Zealand and invited counties in 25 codes. This year the AIMS Games welcomed 373 schools and over 11,700wow! This is an amazing tournament to be a part of and this was the first year that Whenuapai School has attended the games. The reports back from our staff and parent helpers who attended, as well as the amazing tamariki who competed, were all wonderful to hear. We are so proud of our athletes, who not only did well in their respective events but who also represented Whenuapai School to the highest standard and who exemplified the four school values. To and from School

We have been made aware of a young adult approaching people at the bus stop opposite the Park House Cafe who is asking to be tagged on to the public bus. This same person has also been seen sitting outside the dairy and approaching people to ask for various things.

We wanted to bring this to your attention so that you can talk to your children about situations where they feel uncomfortable, scared or unsafe.

If at any time your child feels uncomfortable, scared or unsafe, they should seek out and tell a trusted adult.

As a community it is important to look out for each other on the way to and from School. If you see anything of concern, please do let us know.

We have advised the School's Community Constable about this.

Drop off and Pick Up

Due to the current road works and increased congestion around the school, we thought it was a good time to remind everybody about expectations during school dropoff and pick-up times.

Firstly, it would be great if we could increase the number of tamariki walking to school on a regular basis. Walking to school is great for family time, fitness, developing independence, connecting with friends and our environment.

If you are driving your child to school, please remember

- Keep the bus stop and section of road leading to the bus stop clear at all times
- Only stop and park your vehicle in the designated parking areas
- Please do not stop or park over driveways, yellow lines or the zoned area near the crossing
 - Please also show consideration to our neighbours by not parking across their driveways. Parking across driveways is a parking offence for which the Council can issue tickets
- No U-turns outside of the school or parking areas
- Ensure you slow down when approaching the pedestrian crossing
- Please ensure you use the predestination crossing when crossing the road

All these points are crucial for the health and safety of our tamariki and their whānau.




WHENUAPAI SCHOOL WALKING SCHOOL BUS


