Speech Winners — On Thursday 31 August 2023, three students represented Whenuapai School at the Kahui Ako (Community of Learning) speech finals. This year's theme was Kaitiakitanga and each student took an interesting twist on the concepts. Šárka Langton suggested we remove human habitats in the South Island and turn it into a large bird sanctuary, Lucy Zanders argued that Barbie has both positive and negative impacts on women, and finally, Coban Hosking advocated how important it was to look after Pokemon cards. We are incredibly proud of all three students who each came away with a placing. For the Year 7/8 competition Šárka placed first and Lucy, third and for the Year 5&6 competition, Coben placed secondwell done to all.









Donated Art Work — two of our amazingly talented Year 8 students, Maiyan and Shalev Walhaus-Yahel, have created some stunning murals for our kura. Shalev painted four amazing designs for each of our school houses and Maiyan painted two murals and provided the following information about his incredible artwork "this mural is for one of my bar mitzvah challenges. A bar mitzvah is a Jewish tradition, it's where a boy turns thirteen and is classified as a young man. They have a big celebration, and some parents make them do thirteen challenges which is the traditional way. This is mainly why I chose to do this community service. In the mural you will notice four different aircraft: the Boeing, Seasprite, Orion, and Hercules. These planes are the house planes of Whenuapai School. They are displayed around the mural with other features such as a forest, the Air Base and four birds. The four birds are the Kiwi, Tui, Fantail, and Kea. You will notice they are all NZ natives. My mural is to be seen in the senior campus. Overall, I have enjoyed taking time for this project and I hope you like it. Maiyan - Boeing House Captain". We have been blown away by the talent of both boys and are incredibly grateful for the gift to Whenuapai School. We can't wait for you to see their artwork hung up around the kura soon.

All Black Mascot — Some of you may have recently seen on TV a story about one of our incredible young students, Mason Millan. At the age of two, Mason was diagnosed with leukemia and underwent chemotherapy for over three long years. This incredibly strong and brave young man fought so hard over this grueling time and amazingly is now cancer free. Recently Mason was featured on Seven Sharp to share his story of not only battling leukemia but also to celebrate him being chosen as one of four recipients in the 'Defenders of Tomorrow' competition. Being selected as a Defender of Tomorrow means Mason will be flown to France (with his family) and will have the honor of walking on to the field as a team mascot for the All Blacks in the upcoming Rugby World Cup. An amazing opportunity for this rugby loving, incredibly brave young man. Mason's story serves as a powerful reminder of courage, resilience, and positivity, and we are so happy for him to have this amazing opportunity. 


WHENUAPAI SCHOOL WALKING SCHOOL BUS


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
