your understanding and support you as you guide your tamariki. The safety hub also has free access to <u>Qustodio</u>, a safety app, which can be added to your child's device to enable you to monitor their usage and provide guidance as and when required.



Organisation for 2024 - Thank you to all the families who have let us know they are moving on, this is a huge help for our planning. We are in the final stages of school organisation for 2024, every year this becomes a bigger and more complex process as the school roll continues to grow. Over the coming weeks we will share information as it is finalised.

<u>Senior Campus</u>: Work continues on Stage 2 of the Senior Campus and is scheduled to be completed in March. For Term 1 the Senior Campus will continue with only our Year 7/8 students. Our Year 5/6 students will start at the Senior Campus from the beginning of Term 2. We are holding a parent evening on 29th November at 6pm for all whānau of Year 5 / 6 to learn more.

<u>Kotahitanga - Respect for Others</u> Keeping our hands and feet to ourselves

The PB4L focus for Weeks 6 and 7 actually links to all of our school values. As we move through Term 4, everyone is feeling tired, the temperature is rising, and we have a lot of extra-curricular activities, events, and trips. So, on occasion, we may be a little less tolerant of others and this can lead to frustration. Learning to respect personal boundaries and Keep our hands and feet to ourselves is an important social-emotional skill that helps our tamariki develop positive relationships, and creates a safe and respectful school environment.

Here are a few questions to use at home to initiate further discussions about respecting others' personal space:

- Why is it important to Keep our hands and feet to ourselves?
- How can we show respect for others' personal space in different situations (e.g. lining up, during group work, or in the playground)?
- How should we react if someone is not respecting our personal space? How can we communicate our feelings in a respectful way?
- How does respecting others' personal space contribute to a positive, safe and respectful school environment
- Can you think of any situations where it might be difficult to Keep your hands and feet to yourself? How can you handle these situations appropriately?




WHENUAPAI SCHOOL WALKING SCHOOL BUS




