<u>Mana - Respect for Self</u>
Making sensible choices in all settings


By learning self-control, our children can make good decisions and respond to stressful situations to ensure positive outcomes.

How you can help at home:


- Start the conversation. Explain to your child what it means to make a good decision and why it's important.
- Let them make mistakes. Don't rush in to fix the problem, highlight the misstep and discuss how to make a better choice next time.
- Give your child the opportunity to learn about self-control through play. Playing simple games that promote good decision-making is an excellent way to introduce children to the concept of stopping and thinking about their next move.
- Musical Chairs teaches Kids to make fast, on-thespot decisions.
- Tic Tac Toe helps Kids practice decision-making.
 This game requires Keeping an eye on the opponent to stop them from getting three naughts or crosses in a row and requires concentration and practice.
- Hide and Seek turn it into a game of decisionmaking by adding new rules such as you cannot hide in the same place twice or limit the areas to hide. This compels the child to think of new hiding places, or how to 'hide better' in the same areas.
- Provide an area where your child can calm down and focus. Getting your child to take a short movement break during activities is a good way to foster self-control. You can also include a breathing exercise.
















WHENUAPAI SCHOOL WALKING SCHOOL BUS




