Farewell to Greg Berry: A Thank You for Nine Years of Service

After nine years of outstanding service as Whenuapai School's PE Teacher and Head of Sport, Greg Berry will be leaving us to begin a new chapter in the Hawkes Bay. His final day at Whenuapai School will be Friday, April 4th, 2025.

During his time with us, Greg has made a significant impact on both our school and the wider community. His dedication to developing and strengthening our sports programme has helped shape it into the success it is today. Through his tireless efforts, he has introduced countless students to a wide range of sporting opportunities and provided expert coaching across multiple teams. Greg has consistently gone above and beyond, often dedicating his own time outside of school hours to support our students in their sporting journeys. We are incredibly grateful for his passion, commitment, and the positive influence he has had on so many students.

Greg will be moving to the Hawkes Bay to take up an exciting new role with Sport Hawkes Bay, where he will be working with schools to upskill teachers in physical education and assist in developing health and sports programmes. We know that his knowledge and experience will be a tremendous asset in his new position, and while we will miss him greatly, we are excited for the opportunities ahead of him.

Given the current teacher shortage, we have made the decision to temporarily restructure Greg's roles at Whenuapai School until the end of the 2025 school year. The position will be divided into three parts:

- A temporary or long-term relief teacher will be employed to continue delivering the sport programme as part of the classroom curriculum.
- Olivia Mead (Assistant Principal) will oversee the organisation of all school sporting events, including teams for North West Sport Day competitions.
- A teacher (to be confirmed) will take responsibility for managing teams competing in events outside school hours, such as basketball.

We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work through these changes and will keep you informed once all roles are finalised.

Greg's departure will leave a significant gap at Whenuapai School, but his contributions over the past nine years will have a lasting impact. We sincerely thank Greg for his dedication, enthusiasm, and the positive legacy he leaves behind. We wish him all the best in his new role and future endeavours.





Waste Free Lunchboxes

Whenuapai School is an EnviroSchool and we ask that students come to school with waste free lunches (Nood Food) to show Kaitiakitanga/Respect to our school environment.



A waste free lunch means only packing items that can be composted or recycled. That means, **no plastic wrap**, **no foil**, **no zip lock bags and no packaged foods**. We have compost bins for food scraps which we feed to our worm farm which then fertilises our vegetable māra/gardens and fruit trees. Through this process we are teaching the students to be responsible for the waste they create and how they can make a difference to our planet. If students bring waste to school, we ask them to please take this home. Thank you for supporting our school value of Kaitiakitanga/Respect for the Environment.


